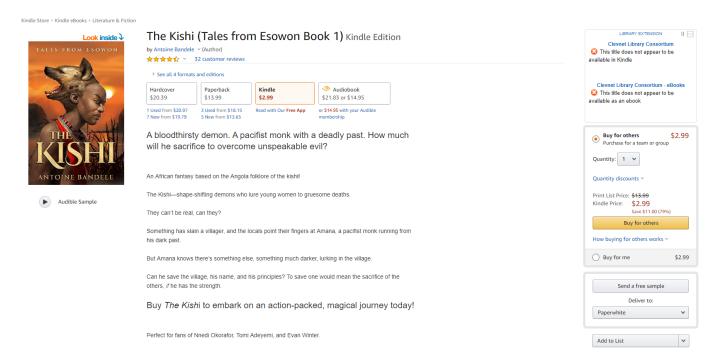

I've gone through many courses/books about marketing and blurbs. I even used "Best Page Forward" for a blurb and AMS/FB ad copy. But it all felt very general. Never had any specific, deep notes. Also, my genre is, what I feel, an emerging genre in African-based fantasy so I don't know where exactly I should align myself to current genre works or who to market to outside of Tomi Adeyemi's "Children of Blood and Bone" or works from N.K. Jemisin or Nnedi Okorafor.

THE BIG THREE

Cover - A gorgeous cover although it does not represent fantasy, emphasizing more African literature and/or folklore. More research needed to determine whether African fantasy is a viable genre for independent authors.

Title - The title is solid but could use a few tweaks. Consider using "chronicles" or "legends" instead of "tales" and also utilize the sub-title real estate with keywords that readers are typing in the Amazon search bar.

Sales Copy - Decent although the lead is buried. Make sure all words are consistent with the presented genre. In addition, consider removing all text below the bolded call to action.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Keywords - *Suggestions shared privately.

Categories -Consider fantasy or some sub-genre of it.

Author Bio -N/A

Author Pic -N/A Reviews - 4.4 on 32. An excellent average but could probably use more reviews.

OUR FINAL THOUGHTS...

The Career Authors have suggested a picking a single genre and then creating a consistent sales page experience based on that choice. Some research suggests that African fantasy is not a genre currently in demand by readers and therefore considering other sub-genres of fantasy (while not changing the story) might make the book more viable. Also, fantasy readers won't often start a series if only the first book is available.
